PE and Sports Premium Funding

In the academic year 2017 – 2018 Keston Primary received £20,130.

The table below shows how this funding was spent:

Amount	Spent On	Impact
£8998	Lunchtime and after school sports coaching - Specialist sports coaches worked with pupils during lunchtime sessions to extend their participation in team games. Additional after school sports clubs were run at no parental cost or heavily discounted rate	Pupils are engaged in organised sporting activity during their lunch break and pupils have access to additional subsidised or free after school sports provision. Provision has increased confidence and skills in a range of sports and benefitted children's ability to communicate effectively and co-operate as a team, skills vital in a wide range of sports.
£2173	New equipment was bought to support and improve the PE Curriculum and lunchtime provision ensuring that teachers and coaches were well equipped and that children had the necessary resources to benefit fully.	The new range of sporting equipment has enabled children to enjoy practicing the skills learnt in lessons, during break and lunchtimes and has also helped foster a love of sport for enjoyment as well as health benefits. It ensured the quality of the lessons being taught was not affected by the loss of or use of damaged equipment.
£316	Competitions and sports registrations – children were involved in a wide range of sporting competitions and festivals	Funding enabled the school to ensure the children were able to take part in a wide range of sport competitions which included: netball, swimming, football and athletics.
£950	Coaching and transport - provision was made to access transport and provide additional coaching for interschool competitions	Provision of transport enabled a wide range of children to take part in inter school sporting activities and to attend sporting events as spectators. Additional coaching ensured teams were able to further develop their skills e.g. swimming squad took part in deep water swimming practice which we are unable to access at the school pool.
£6500	Enhanced swimming provision – contribution towards swimming pool facility and upkeep to ensure pool is able to be used throughout the year by both pupils at the school and members of the local community. Contribution towards swimming instructor to ensure all pupils within the school are able to take part in weekly swimming sessions.	Contribution towards work to enhance swimming provision at the school enabling all pupils from Reception to Year 6 to taken part in weekly swimming lessons
£1200	Sports Track – part funding of all-weather track on school field and safety surface under Early Years climbing equipment	All-weather track will enable all children within the school to take part in daily miles enhancing pupil fitness and health.
