We will explore the meaning of words and how to use a range of strategies when we come across unfamiliar words in our reading. Our main focus is on Miss Root, the new dentist, and the impression of her that we get as we read about her actions and the way in which the previous dentist died. We will also investigate rounding in the context of word problems.
