

# Keston Primary School and Nursery

## Curriculum Information



### Looking ahead... Nursery Summer 1

We will be looking at the stories of *The Bog Baby*, *The Gruffalo* and learning about farm animals.

We will develop investigation skills using all our senses to learn about our school environment and the wider world, including looking closely at natural patterns and combining materials.

We also follow the children's interests and adapt our activities to meet their needs.

In **Personal Social and Emotional Development** we will continue to develop relationships with peers, enabling the children to extend each other's play ideas. We will encourage the children to talk about their home and community, as well as provide opportunities for the children to carry out small tasks around the Nursery. We will continue to support the children in being aware of the feelings and needs of other children and support them in turn taking and sharing.

In **Communication & Language** we will model, and encourage the children to use more complex sentences, using talk to explain ideas about what's happening and what might happen next. We will also ask lots of 'how' and 'why' questions for the children to consider.

For **Physical Development**, the children will be encouraged to remove and put on their shoes and socks for physical activities in the school hall. During our allocated hall sessions this term, we will include movement, dance, and using small & large apparatus. We'll be using the field for some of our outdoor activities.

We will continue to practice using pencils, scissors and other one handed tools with good control, and encourage children to form the letters of their name clearly.

In **Literacy**, we will use story books to look at how stories are structured and begin to predict how a story might end. We will be recognising familiar signs and logos. The children are continuing to learn about letters and sounds in phonics. We will also explore rhyme and alliteration through books, stories and songs.

In **Mathematics** we will continue to practise recognising numbers, and how we can represent numbers in different ways. We will begin to understand the concept of sharing a group of objects, and solve simple number problems. We will continue to use the Numberblocks CBeebies series to investigate numbers.

In **Understanding the World** we will explore animals and their habitats, starting with pond creatures and then moving on to farm animals. We will begin to think about different occupations. We will encourage the children to use technological toys, such as cameras, mobile phones, tills etc.

In **Expressive Arts & Design**, we will continue to develop imaginative play through small world role play, creating their own simple story lines. We will also further develop colour mixing skills, painting and printing techniques. In construction and junk modelling, we will encourage children to build with a purpose.

**How to help your child** - To support your child's learning and development this half term, you could encourage him/her to manage small tasks and routines independently at home and when coming in to Nursery.



Please continue to send in feedback forms from the Learning Library, and the WOW moment slips of anything you have noticed them doing at home. They are really useful to have as a part of the child's learning journal and might give us an insight in to something we might not see in the Nursery!

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During this half term, we would like to invite you to join us for part of the morning to join in with the children's independent learning activities and share your child's Learning Folder with them.
