

Mathematics

As mathematicians, we will be predominantly focussing on fractions where we will find fractions of quantities to solve problems. We will also be applying our times table knowledge to simplify and find equivalent fractions. We will use this knowledge to find the decimal and percentage equivalents. The second half of the term will focus on shape properties and statistics. We will continue to focus on our arithmetic skills.

English

We will be studying and evaluating two different books, 'Goodnight Mister Tom' and 'Rose Blanche.' We will be concentrating on a variety of different genres such as letter writing, diary writing, writing in role, newspaper articles and writing descriptions of characters and settings.

We will also be concentrating on spelling, punctuation and grammar. In spelling we will now be sending home the National Curriculum year 5 and 6 words that children will need to be able to spell.

We encourage regular reading at home and regular use of reading records to support the children in achieving their goals.

Science

As scientists we will be revising and extending our knowledge of light. We will be exploring how light travels and forms shadows. We will achieve this through various investigations where children will be able to plan, measure, record their data as well as ask further questions to enhance their learning.
