Mathematics

As mathematicians, we will be focussing on place value, rounding, addition and subtraction and division. In the second half of the term we will look at money, fractions and decimals. There will be a focus on reasoning where children will need to apply their knowledge in different ways. We will also be focussing on arithmetic skills.

Science

As scientists we will be revising and extending our knowledge of electricity and circuits. Later on, in the term we will be moving onto how to keep ourselves healthy. This will include the digestive and circulatory systems and the various food groups.

Explore and Discover

As geographers, during the first half of the term we will be studying the continent of North America. We will be looking at land use, economic distribution, resources and tourism.

In the second half of the term we will be looking at the impact of extreme weather on the environment.

Art / DT / Food Technology

This term we will be designing and creating our own functioning wind turbines. In Food Technology we will be create a healthy dish.

Computing

As computer scientists, we will be learning how to become market analysts using a variety of different computer programs.

English

To develop our English skills, we will be studying Kensuke's Kingdom. While studying this book, we will be writing in a variety of genres including creating a ship's log, recounts, information texts and character descriptions. In the second half of the term, we move onto studying some of Shakespeare's plays including Macbeth where children will be able to write play scripts, setting descriptions and have opportunities to perform in front of an audience. We will also have a weekly focus on grammar, punctuation and spelling and will be teaching a reading comprehension weekly to develop children's reading skills.

Alongside this, we will be focussing on reading VIPERS which will improve the children's Vocabulary, Inference,

Prediction, Explaining, Retrieval and Summarising skills.

We encourage regular reading at home and regular use of reading records to support the children in achieving their goals.
