

Vocabulary / Key Terms Amphibians Amphibians live in the water as babies and on land as they grow older. They have smooth, slimy skin. Birds. All birds have a beak, two legs, feathers and wings. Fish. Fish live and breathe under water. They have scaly skin, fins to help them swim and they breathe through gills. Mammals Mammals breathe air, grow hair or fur and feed on their mother's milk as a baby. Reptiles All reptiles breathe air. They have scales

on their skin.

Important Facts

Animals that mostly eat other animals (meat) are called carnivores. Lions, cheetahs, tigers, sharks, and polar bears are carnivores.

Animals that only eat plants are called herbivores. Deer, cows, elephants, horses and giraffes are herbivores.

Animals that eat both plants and other animals are omnivores. Birds, humans, chickens, squirrels and catfish are omnivores.

Humans are animals—they are mammals.

Snakes, tortoises, lizards and alligators are reptiles.

Goldfish, tuna, sharks and eels are fish.

Frogs, toads, newts and salamanders are amphibians.
