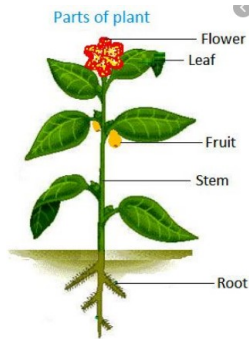

Important Facts

Tulips, daffodils and pansies are common garden plants.

Bluebells, ivy and primroses are common wild plants

Sweet chestnut, horse chestnut, oak, elm, apple and pear trees are deciduous.

Pine, olive, cypress, and fir trees are evergreen trees.

Plants need water, light, a suitable temperature, air and time to grow.

Vegetables are plants.

Trees can live for over 1000 years.

Vocabulary / Key Terms

root	The roots of a plant act as an anchor, fixing the plant into the ground. They also absorb water and minerals to help the plant to grow.
stem	The stem carries water and nutrients to different parts of the plant. It also provides support and keeps the plant standing upright.
flower	Flowers look pretty and come in lots of different colours. They can also smell lovely. This helps to attract animals and insects that help the plant to make seeds for new plants.
leaf	The leaves are very important they absorb the sunlight which they use to make food for the plant.
deciduous	The word deciduous means to “fall off”, and every autumn these trees shed their leaves .
evergreen	An evergreen plant/tree is a one that has leaves throughout the year that are always green and don't fall out.
