PE and Sports Premium Funding – 2021 -2022



Purpose of funding

Schools have to spend the sport funding on improving provision of PE and sport but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

The vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium: **ALL** pupils leaving primary school **physically literate** and with the **knowledge, skills and motivation** necessary to equip them for a **healthy, active lifestyle** and **lifelong participation** in physical activity and sport

The funding has been provided to ensure impact against the following **OBJECTIVE**: To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools. It is important to emphasise that the focus of spending must lead to long lasting impact against the vision that will live on well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding.

It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

Key Indicator 1: the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school.

Key Indicator 2: the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement.

Key Indicator 3: increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.

Key Indicator 4: broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.

Key Indicator 5: increased participation in competitive sport.

In the academic year 2021 – 2022 Keston Primary received £19,560 in addition to 2020/21 carry forward of £17,646.62
