
#### Attendance

The Department for Education tracks attendance carefully and our aim is to have an attendance figure in excess of the national average of 96%. Our target for attendance this year is 96.5% Our attendance figure for the year to date is 96.3%.

Obviously attendance levels, especially at this time of year, can be affected by illness, particularly tummy bugs. We would therefore encourage all parents to send their children into school wherever possible. However, if they have been ill with sickness and/or diarrhoea, please keep them off school until they have been symptom free for a minimum of 48 hours. This is to prevent the bug spreading throughout the school community as this has a significant, adverse effect on attendance levels of both children and staff.



If you arrive late to school everyday your learning begins to suffer. Below is a graph showing how being late to school everyday over a school year adds up to lost learning time.

Arriving on time for school is important, as late arrivals are disruptive for the class and can be embarrassing for the child who is late. Children can also miss important information during registration including the plan for the day.

- Classroom doors open at 8.45am
- School starts at 8.55am for KS2 / 9.00am in EYFS and KS1
- Late arrival is between 8.55am 9.25am in KS2 and 9.00am - 9.25am EYFS and KS1.
- Arrival after 9.25am is recorded as an unauthorised absence..

Any unauthorised absence negatively impacts on our overall attendance figure as well as your child's attendance and achievement levels.

#### **Keston Primary School expectations:**

- All children will arrive on time and be appropriately prepared for the day continued lateness will be followed up by the school office or a senior member of staff.
- All parents are to sign in their child if arriving late on our Entry System in the school office.
- Health appointments should be made out of school hours whenever possible.
- Absences through illness should be reported to the school office by 9.30 am.
- Holidays are not to be taken in term time due to a change in government regulations we are unable to authorise holiday absence even if your child has excellent attendance.
- Any absence for holidays will be unauthorised and if the attendance falls below an
  acceptable level, you may incur a fine.
- A leave of absence in term time can only be authorised in exceptional circumstances.
- If you take the decision to take an unauthorised leave of absence during term time please fill in a leave of absence form. This saves us trying to contact you every day to find out why your child is absent.
