Obviously attendance levels, especially at this time of year, can be affected by illness, particularly tummy bugs. We would therefore encourage all parents to send their children into school wherever possible. However, if they have been ill with sickness and/or diarrhoea, please keep them off school until they have been symptom free for a minimum of 48 hours. This is to prevent the bug spreading throughout the school community as this has a significant, adverse effect on attendance levels of both children and staff.



The Department for Education tracks attendance carefully and our aim is to have an attendance figure in excess of the national average of 96%. Our target for attendance this year is 96.5% Our attendance figure for the year to date is 96.3%.



Regular Attendance means Punctual Attendance

Arriving on time for school is important as late arrivals are disruptive for the class and can be embarrassing for the child who is late. Children can also miss important information during registration including the plan for the day.

- Classroom doors open at 8.45am
- School starts at 8.55am for KS2 / 9.00am in EYFS and KS1
- Late arrival is between 8.55am 9.25am in KS2 and 9.00am - 9.25am EYFS and KS1.
- Arrival after 9.25am is recorded as an unauthorised absence..

Any unauthorised absence negatively impacts on our overall attendance figure as well as your child's attendance and achievement levels.

When is it not ok for your child to stay away from school

- Holidays only in exceptional circumstances will term time holidays be authorised by the school.
- Birthdays your child should still attend, even if it is their birthday.
- Shopping/Family Days Out or any other activity for which there is no serious reason for your child to stay away from school.

If you need to request absence from learning, please complete an 'Exceptional Leave' request form available from the school office, or the school website and return it to school.



Remembrance Day

If you need help this Christmas with providing a dinner for your family or would like a toy to give as a present please come and talk to Mrs Stevens as soon as possible.








Labelling of Uniform
