Uniform

- Mid-grey tailored shorts
- Mid-grey straight leg, traditional trouser
- Grey pinafore dress
- Grey skirt skirts should be at least knee length but no more than 10cm below the knee.
 Straight skirts are not permitted.
- White or blue cellular collared sports shirts or t-shirt, plain or with school badge
- Royal blue sweatshirt or cardigan with school badge
- Socks mid-grey or white
- Tights mid grey / black

Please make sure that all children's school uniform is named.

- Royal blue shorts, white t-shirt.
- Plimsolls or trainers (black or white) are required for outdoor activities; please try to buy the slip on style/velcro.

KS2

- Royal blue shorts, white t-shirt,
- Plimsolls or trainers (black or white) with socks are required for outdoor activities.
- Tracksuit bottoms are useful for cold weather. Tracksuit bottoms must be black or navy and free of any logos and should be worn with a normal Keston School Jumper.

Eco-Committee News


On the 18th and 25th of January the Eco-Committee met to discuss the results of an Eco Schools environmental audit. This was a questionnaire sent out to classes asking what we currently do in an effort to be a sustainable school. It was a useful exercise as it generated a lot of ideas about what we could be doing. As part of our Eco schools journey, we have focussed on saving energy We have already raised the profile of energy conservation with our 'Remember to turn off lights' posters. These were designed by pupils and are displayed around the school. The environmental audit enables us all to think about what we would like to do next.

The results of the audit were collated and it was decided that reducing waste, improving school grounds and addressing the problem of litter, are the topic areas we would like to prioritise.

As a first step to reducing waste, the Eco-Committee made very useful scrap paper notepads for their teachers. The school is keen to reduce paper waste and unnecessary photocopying. The children worked as a team using a range of skills.

The Eco-Committee are very enthusiastic and have a wealth of ideas as to how we can become a more sustainable school. Asked why she wanted to join the Eco -Committee, one of the children said 'I joined because I don't like seeing litter on the floor when I'm walking to school. I wanted to do something about it.'

Another commented, 'I want to save the planet, it is dying from all the plastic.'
