Literacy

We will:

- · Homework books will be sent out on a Friday and are to be returned the following Tuesday.
- Explore the key texts 'Supertato: Veggies Assemble' and 'My Mum has X-Ray Vision'
- Begin daily phonics sessions following the Little Wandle scheme to develop our early reading skills
- Begin to read a few common exception words (1, the, is)
- Engage in a variety of mark making activities to develop our writing skills

Children will begin to bring home a sound book each Friday containing letter formation practise. These are to be returned the following Tuesday.













Maths

We will be:

- Counting aloud
- Comparing groups more/less/equal to
- Counting forwards and backwards
- Counting objects and recognising numerals and the relationship between consecutive numbers
- Matching numerals and amounts

- Become familiar with daily school routines to help build our confidence and independence
- Learn to understand and follow classroom expectations
- Recognise our emotions and be able to talk about them
- Develop our love of learning!

- Exploring seasonal changes in Autumn


Expressive Art and Design

- Role-play in the 'home corner'








Communication and Language

We will:


- Develop listening and attention skills by listening to, and joining in with, stories and rhymes
