- Use a range of punctuation in our writing, including introducing the possessive apostrophes and using commas to separate items in a list.
- Continue to use adjectives to create expanded noun phrases.

As readers, we will

- Study The Princess and the White Bear King by Tanya Robyn Batt.
- Continue to improve our inference and prediction skills when reading a story.
