As mathematicians, we will begin the term by recapping statistics and learning about place value. This is an excellent opportunity for the children to recap any areas they were less confident with from the Autumn Term. We will then be moving on to multiplication and division where we will be working with formal methods to calculate. At the end of the term we will begin working with fractions.

Make sure to log onto Times Table Rockstars to practise your multiplication and division facts. This will make a big difference to our learning in school.

As writers, we will be exploring some new genres including: legends, newspaper reports and writing from a different character's perspective. Much of our writing this half term will be linked to our History topic on the Romans. The children will be expanding their knowledge of sentence structure to develop more complex sentences as well as widening their range of punctuation.

As readers, we will be continuing to follow our VIPERS sessions to develop reading skills, focusing on a Non-Fiction text this half term titled 'Meet the Romans'.

As musicians, we will be learning how to play the recorder, focusing on instrument handling and technique and pentatonic scales.

As computer scientists, we will be developing our understanding of online safety including how to set strong and secure passwords, understanding online identities and explaining what to do when online bullying takes place.


Our computing unit will link with Wellbeing week, which will take place at the end of this half term.

As historians/geographers, we will be considering the life of the Romans. We will compare ancient and modern maps and learn about the Roman political system and way of life. We will consider the Roman influence on Britain and how many changes can still be seen today.
